*Power to the Pizza* is a heart-warming, laugh-out-loud kids' comedy about sixth-grader **Jack Parker**, a regular kid just trying to make it through middle school without being embarrassed by his overly dotting mom. When his mom takes a job in the school cafeteria, Jack hopes nothing dramatic will happen — until one fateful lunch service where she “runs out” of pizza for the school's toughest bully... and instead hands him a wobbling slab of meatloaf.

That one moment — and one slow-motion wink from Mrs. Parker — sends shockwaves through the cafeteria. Overnight, Jack becomes the accidental ruler of sixth grade, adored and feared because *him*? What's left is a boy forced to learn what real leadership and confidence look like without perks or pizza.
